Brussels Privacy Hub at CPDP 2017

CPDP 2017 Launch Event Patterns, Profiling and PNR: The new PNR Directive and its implications

On 24 January 2017, the Brussels Privacy Hub and Privacy Salon hosted the 2017 Edition of our CPDP Launch Event: "Patterns, profiling and PNR: The new PNR directive and its implications". We were delighted to welcome distinguished speakers Mr Willem De Beuckelaere (Belgian Privacy Commissioner), Ms Christiane Höhn (Council of the European Union), Ms Sophie in 't Veld (MEP) and Mr Marc Rotenberg (EPIC, US). His Excellency M. François Roux, Permanent Representative of Belgium to the EU introduced the event.



The debate addressed concerns with implementing the recently-adopted, intra-EU Passenger Name Record (PNR) Directive. It also examined the impact of recent developments in the US on the transfer of PNR data across the Atlantic. Finally, the debate addressed the consequences for the Directive of the recent CJEU judgments in the *Tele2/Watson* cases.

The event was supported by Privacy Camp and kindly hosted by the Permanent Representation of Belgium to the EU.
