Who can apply?

To qualify for admission you need to have:

- a law degree (J.D., LLM or equivalent) that entitles you to practise law in your country of origin
- excellent academic results and references
- proven proficiency in English

Students are selected on the basis of their academic qualifications as well as work and other related experience.

About our school

The Brussels School of Governance is an alliance between the Institute for European Studies (VUB) and Vesalius College. This LLM in International and European Law is a programme of which the degree will be awarded by the Vrije Universiteit Brussel.

What can you study?

After a solid set of 8 core courses (30 credits) on EU institutional law and judicial protection, EU external relations law, EU economic law, public international and comparative law, human rights and competition law, students can choose to focus on one of 3 specialisation options (12 credits). You close off the programme with a Master's thesis (18 credits).
